Written by Louise Park Brockbank Reynolds to her grandson Robert Newel Reynolds While he served in the Central States Mission of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints



Louise Park Brockbank Reynolds (28 January 1869 – 17 August 1963) was in her 90th year when she started writing this sequence of letters to her grandson Newel in 1958. Each of the letters was written in longhand—usually in ink. Most were addressed and mailed by her. The letters portray a fervent and faithful servant of the Lord Jesus Christ who never, not even once, wavered in her belief and conviction of the restored truths revealed through and promulgated by the Prophet Joseph Smith. As her grandson and recipient of these letters I add my witness to hers of the significance and everlasting meaning and value of the principles she so frequently espoused. Those members of her family who have heeded her words have found joy and happiness in their lives and abundance in their blessings. Not a few of her progeny have risen far beyond their normal expectations to achieve power added upon power in their spiritual lives and in their earthly blessings. For her purity and demonstration of greatness we thank you Grandma for your example and valor in life and for your generous sharing of yourself in all ways good and virtuous. When I went on my mission in 1959 I was the fourth grandchild of Louise Park Brockbank Reynolds to do so. Perhaps there were others but I specifically remember that LaDell had served in Brazil, and Shirley Reynolds and Marilyn Mackay had gone to the Central States. Now I was going to the same place. My father had also served in the Central States in 1926 and 1927. My mission was a proselyting mission and the Lord blessed my companions and I with great experiences. One door I knocked on in Ferguson, Missouri resulted in the baptisms of the Joseph King family. All three children would grow up to serve missions and graduate from BYU. One son later served as Bishop in Wichita, Kansas.

Mrs. Reynolds, who is in good health and takes care of her own home, was born Jan. 28, 1869, in Holladay, a daughter of Isaac and Mary Park Brockbank. She married Charles R. Reynolds April 13, 1892, in the Logan Temple, Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He died in 1950.

She has been active in the Church, all her life, having served in the Relief Society as teacher and been president of the Mutual Improvement Assn. in the South Cottonwood Ward for seven years. She is the mother of nine

sons and daughters. They in-clude Mrs. William (Mabel) Baker, Mrs. Arthur (Merl) Mackay, Rulon Jay Reynolds, Heber Clyde Reynolds and Mrs. Osborne (Lila) Corringe, all of Murray; Charles Leonall of Murray; Charles Leon-ard Reynolds and Owen Ford Reynolds, both of Holladay; Mrs. Wilford (Hazel) Pierson, Sandy, and Mrs. John (Ver-netta) Stillman, East Mill Creek. She has 36 grandchil-dren, 83 great-grandchildren and two great-great-grandchil-dren. dren
